The School undertakes to:

- Provide a safe and supportive working environment
- Provide a broad and balanced curriculum in line with the National Curriculum and other statutory requirements.
- Provide induction support for new students.
- Provide a high standard of teaching which challenges each student to achieve their potential.
- Make regular assessments of student progress which will be made available to parents on-line, via reports and parents evenings/ Review Days.
- Ensure the regular marking of student work to inform further progress.
- Provide opportunities through a structured Personal, Social and Health; Citizenship and Careers Education programme for students to reflect upon making appropriate choices in their lives both within and out of school.
- Provide opportunities for students to participate in extra-curricular activities.
- Ensure the setting and marking of homework in accordance with the homework timetable
- Provide a pastoral care system which is supportive to the emotional needs of all students and works in close partnership with parents.
- Adhere to clear Behaviour and Anti – Bullying policies which are open and accessible to all and which set out the expectations of good behaviour.
- Provide work to be completed at home if a student receives a fixed-term exclusion
- Contact parents promptly should any concerns arise including lack of punctuality or poor attendance at school.
- Provide assistance from the Director of Student Learning where a student is deemed to require additional support.

We expect parents to agree that they will do all they can to ensure that their child:

- Attends school punctually and at all required times and is not absent for reasons other than ill health or other circumstances agreed with the School.
- Understands that the School expects the highest standards of work and behaviour both in school and on school related trips or activities.

- Arrives at school with the appropriate books and equipment (including that required for PE)
- Complies with the uniform requirements.
- Completes all homework set and does so to the best of their ability.

We ask that parents should also:

- Telephone the School on the first day of any absence, explaining the nature and expected length of the absence. This should be followed up with a note on the student's return to school.
- Support the Behaviour and Anti – Bullying Policies.
- Ensure that all documents are returned promptly
- Avoid, wherever possible, taking holidays during term time. All absence from school has a detrimental effect on a student's learning and progress.
- Liaise regularly with the School by attending Parent's Evenings and Review Day.
- Inform the School about any issue that might affect their child's work or behaviour.
- Contact the headteacher in the event of serious concerns about the education provided by the School as part of the Complaints Policy.

We expect students to:

- Work hard at all times and take responsibility for their actions
- Aim for success by striving for rewards and achieving targets
- Attend regularly and punctually
- Show consideration for the learning of others
- Behave in an acceptable way according to the behaviour and Anti – Bullying policies
- Attend school in full uniform and with all books and equipment (including that needed for PE)
- Complete all class work and homework on time
- Show self-respect and respect for others including respect for other people's property
- Stay safe and be mindful of the safety of others
- Take letters home and ensure parents receive them.
