A number of exams and practical moderations have already taken place and we have been very pleased with the way that Year 11 have conducted themselves so far, this bodes well for the bulk of the examinations still to come. Recently, we wrote to parents regarding our move from Firefly to Classcharts. We have now completed the transfer and all students have been issued with their login codes. It is also important that all parents access their account so they can review the rewards, behaviour and homework for their child. We are aware of a number of negative comments on social media recently, regarding a perceived change in school rules linked to toilet use during lessons. Firstly, there has been no change to the rules. However, we understand where this misunderstanding has come from. Toilet use during lessons is now logged through Classcharts as this helps us spot trends and ensures we are aware of who is legitimately out of class. Unfortunately, a small number of students have received minus points in error as the system added a default -1 point for the log. This issue has been rectified. The school's stance on toilet use has not changed. We do encourage students to use the bathrooms during break times and also inform students that staff will release them from lesson at their discretion. Contrary to the perceptions of some, we do have student toilets around the school in the Mersey, the Lune, the Ribble, the Yarrow and the Aisling. We would also politely request that if there are concerns regarding school issues that we are contacted directly rather than comments being posted through social media.

Since our return to school after Easter we have worked hard to raise the importance of 'getting the basics right'. We have held assemblies and discussed with students our vision of what we would like to see on a daily basis from them and the personal attributes we hope to foster to help ensure their success beyond Tarleton Academy. In addition, we have also reminded students how they are rewarded for their engagement in lessons and for following the school rules. We have also re-iterated why we believe good behaviour and high standards form the foundations of our collective success. As is usually the case, we remain incredibly proud of how our students present themselves and generally behave, however, skirt length is still a perennial issue with a small number of our students. We welcome your support in ensuring skirts rest at the top of the knee as a minimum. In the coming weeks we will be contacting you if skirt length is an issue. We would also like to remind students that make-up should be 'discreet' and that the same judgement also applies to 'fake tan'.
